So you never show that you're counting cards. That is the cardinal sin, Ray" (the Rain man)This is something that we see it very frequently with the disabled community. One family member supposedly is going to take care of them but they want something from them. It can be the money they will receive to take care of them, get a less expensive housing and etc. Their hearts are not to get help for their disabled relative but to get whatever they can for their own good. This is something that in the movie is clear.

Temple Grandin is a woman who was diagnosed with autism as a child and as an adult have a career in psychology and animal science. She became an activist and advocate for the autistic community. In 2010, her life was put on a movie, the movie was "Temple Grandin". This movie describe her a autistic person who is super smart because she has a "photo visual" mind that helps her to get to college. Also, the difficulties she had because her lack of socialization and do not tolerate to be touched at all when she was in college. She went to her aunt's ranch and here was where her life change. She became interested in how to make the

caddles death less scary because she felt their fear as it was hers. Because of her interest in this, she invented the slaughter for animals." It is not good way to run a stockyard. I believe what's good for caddle is also good for business" (Temple Grandin). She was passionate about science too and that was how she was abe to do her invention "But my favorite of Einstein's words on religion is 'science without religion is lame. Religion without science is blind" (Temple Grandin). This movie has been seen as inspirational because how she make her own ways in her life. Although, the movie successfully give the audience a positive view about autism, it gives the wrong idea that all "functioning autistic adult" can be as smart as Grandin was. When the reality was that Grandin was coming from a wealthy family and had the money to pay for resources that were not available for other individuals.
